News From the Southern Utah Wilderness Alliance, SUWA

****Note the Following Article***

On Saturday, January 18, judge Urbina of the U.S. District Court ruled in favor of SUWA and other conservation groups to temporarily block the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) from leasing more than 110,000 acres of Utah wilderness. (Although we were not part of the suit, we appreciate their efforts.)

SUWA Update

Today, [email dated 4 February 2009] Interior Secretary Salazar canceled the sale of 77 oil and gas leases on wilderness-quality lands, which were offered for sale in December 2008 by the Bush administration. SUWA and our environmental partners filed suit to stop the leasing, and in January a federal judge granted a temporary restraining order that prevented the Bureau of Land Management from finalizing the sale. Secretary Salazar's decision is a tremendous step forward, ensuring that spectacular public landscapes like Desolation Canyon, areas near Arches and Canyonlands National Park, Dinosaur National Monument and Nine Mile Canyon will be given a reprieve from the chopping block.
