## Nine Mile Canyon Analysis

**From Jon Gum, board member**

The following statements are made by comparing two 12-hour days in Nine-Mile Canyon, one in 2008, with my wife, Sue; the other on June 29, 2009 with Sue and three other people.

1. In 2008 we encountered 14 trucks (with two trailers each) on a Sunday morning. In 2009 on a Thursday, we encountered fewer than 10 trucks with two trailers the whole day. The reasons for a decline could be several - reduced drilling due to economic conditions and government changes in priority, or maybe the pressure put on by URARA and other groups had contributed. Whatever the reason, it was a welcome relief.

2. In 2008 the trailers were moving fast, and raising a lot of dust, and the drivers had their eye on the target - doing their job in as little time as possible. In 2009, we had two trucks stop in the middle of the road and tell us about granaries and pit houses that could be visited or viewed. One of the drivers even left his truck and walked several hundred yards to get us positioned properly. Again, quite a change and very nice gestures. Even though many panels still had excessive dust on them, there was not as much dust being produced on the Thursday.

I am sure the struggle is not yet over, and as soon as the government and Barrett have mutual goals, the pressure will be on again. Meanwhile, I think Troy and his group, as well as the other organizations that contributed deserve credit for what appears to be a hiatus.


As part of URARA's work on the environmental impact statement for the West Tavaputs Plateau, there is interest in testing the extent of rock art to the west of Minnie Maud Creek in Nine Mile Canyon. If we can find and document rock art in this area, it might be possible to extend the boundaries of the area to be protected and monitored. We would like to do this work on **Friday and Saturday** August 28 - 29. Note that this is a documentation project with an emphasis on finding and documenting rock art in the area. Members with experience in working with IMACS forms will be very helpful, although this is not necessary to attend. We also need people who are willing to find, photograph, and draw the rock art sites.

Temperatures will likely be hot and we will be away from vehicles for several hours at a time. Appropriate clothing, footwear, and day packs for water, food, and documentation gear are essential. Four wheel drive and high clearance vehicles are unnecessary.

We have not made camping arrangements yet, although this can be discussed later. Given the temperature in the area during August, it may be preferable to stay in hotels in either Wellington or Price. Our work will be in the western most part of Nine Mile Canyon, so it will be easy to commute back and forth for those who are not interested in camping.

URARA has made available funds to reimburse travel costs associated with documentation projects. There are caps on the amount that can be reimbursed.

## ***Secrecy or Education in the Technology Era***

This is a portion of an updated short article, which I wrote for one of the caving journals quite a few years ago. Rock art groups and caving groups seem to have rather close parallels. That a cave is an environmentally sensitive place, and as such it is desirable to keep the location secret, or controlled in some fashion in order to protect said environment. It is a commonly held belief that rock art localities need to be kept secret in order to protect the rock art from being molested in some fashion.

In order to protect a cave, several means may be used. Among them are cave gates or fences. Another possibility is that of buying up the land around the entrance in order to control access to the cave. Rock art localities could and should, receive the same degree of protection.

Secrecy may substitute for protection. In Arizona, it is common to refer to caves in the state by saying that "Arizona doesn't have any caves to speak about." Rock art receives the same protection. Years ago, I pointed out that with the new technology, that is the use of GPS receivers, once you take a person to visit a locality; the location is compromised. It is possible to make a note as to the location. The locality, latitude and longitude can be saved, and may be widely disseminated.

Technology has now taken a giant step; GPS receivers are now available as an integral part of a camera. When the image is taken the GPS coordinates are saved as part of the EXIF portion of the image file. Each picture thus contains location information, which is easily distributed.

Would it not make good sense to have built into our educational system an appreciation and awareness of rock art? Could teachers have available, as an example, say a rock art coloring book? Within the coloring book would be simple phrases, which would tell about the origin and value of rock art. Are there teachers, retired, or otherwise who can visualize such a teaching tool? Are there URARA members who could author a book or booklet usable within the educational system? Could such a book or booklet, be printed and made available by URARA as a public service?
