President's Message

Registration materials for the Blanding URARA symposium are included in this issue of *Vestiges*. There are separate registration forms for the symposium, field trips, for hats and t-shirts. A vendor form is also included. This year, send all registration forms to one address, with one check for payment. Vendors send application forms and payment to Walt Layton. You will receive an acknowledgement of your registration and your field trip assignment, by email, beginning during the week of August 23. Pre-registration for the symposium and field trips ends on September 22. You may register at the symposium after this date.

Field trip registration is first-come, first-served based on postmarks. You will receive an initial field trip assignment based on your preferences. Beginning September 25, you will receive detailed instructions for your field trips. Please provide an accurate, legible email address. If you do not have an email address, you can send a stamped, self-addressed envelope. The field trip listing will be included in the August email to members notifying them that *Vestiges* is online. If you are not a member as of August 1 and are planning to attend the symposium, you may request a pdf copy of the file from Lois Mansfield (lem@virginia.edu) or Troy Scotter (troyscotter@comcast.net).

This year, we have several different types of field trips. On Friday, there is a river trip along the San Juan River with ruins and rock art. On Friday and Monday, the Ute Mountain Tribal Park will give private tours to URARA members. Ben Everitt is offering a three-day backpack trip Oct 5-7 in Grand Gulch prior to the meeting. Huck's trading post is offering a special tour of the owner's private collection. The river trip departs from Bluff, and the Ute Mountain Tribal Park trips from Cortez. Both of these trips require a non-refundable payment in advance for registration. Sign up for all of these on the field trip registration form.

We have outstanding speakers for you: Robert McPherson, Winston Hurst, Ben Bellorado, Fred Blackburn, Steve Simms and Francois Gohier. In addition, we have just learned that Sally Cole has accepted our invitation to be a speaker!

This year the URARA banquet will be on Sunday night. More information on other URARA social events will be in the September *Vestiges*. See you in Blanding!



Field Trip to Wyoming

August 6-9, 2010

The trip will begin in Kemmerer, Wyoming. From there we will drive north and meet BLM archeologist Sam Drucker at Names Hill. He will lead us to the Gateway site and the LaBarge Bluffs sites, along with petroglyphs at Names Hill. That night, we will bed down at Rock Springs or Green River and meet retired BLM archeologist Russ Tanner for a tour to White Mountain and Cedar Canyon sites. We will head up to Lander from White Mountain. I will lead us from there to Castle Gardens and up through Thermopolis and Legend Rock. The next day, BLM archeologist Mike Bies will take us to Medicine Lodge Park and the nature conservative near Ten Sleep. This will complete the formal tour, but if enough folks wish, we can explore sites near Dubois on the west side of the Wind River Mountains. There are many things to explore related to the Oregon and Mormon trails, and the area is spectacular. If you have never experienced South Pass, this is the trip. Be prepared to stop on back roads for cowboys moving cattle between pastures. I recommend members be prepared to camp and do motels. Kemmerer has limited developed campgrounds, Rock Springs has them but they are treeless, crushed rock sites. When you get to Riverton/Ten Sleep/Worland, the campgrounds are fine. For those attending, I will provide a detailed attachment with meeting places, times and recommendations. This will be an adventure trip, with driving similar to the Texas field trip. Personally, I plan to carry tenting gear but do motels when practical. Camping in Medicine Lodge Park is memorable, but there is a motel and campground in Ten Sleep. Rock art styles we will see include Dinwoody, Castle Gardens and Shield.

Think About It!



[Sally Cole, who has recently agreed to be one of this year's symposium's featured speakers, is the author of an excellent book from which we quoted in Think About It! in November 2004 and July 2005 *Vestiges*. The quotes were from Chapter 3, The Study of Rock Art. It is appropriate to include these quotes again. Please see more in Editors' message]

"Rock art interpretation involves making associations between rock art and past cultures and attempting to explain how the rock art functions and what meaning it might have had to past societies. Explanations of function and meaning are tentative because the rock art now exists out of its living cultural context. Archaeological records are fragmentary at best; the farther one goes back in time the possibility increases that records are incomplete." p. 36.

"Recent theories for the study of rock art and other archaeological materials have emphasized the roles played by context and symbolism. It has been proposed that symbols such as rock art images are most likely to be meaningful when examined within the contexts of time, place, culture, and society and with the knowledge that symbolism is part of information exchange, communication systems, and acts to express and reinforce group identities. . ." p37.

Editors' Message

We were very pleased to learn that Sally Cole will be one of the featured speakers at the 2010 symposium. In 1995, we joined an Earth Watch project, which was documenting the rock art in the Grand Gulch. Sally Cole was the archaeologist directing the project. We joined a team of 12 participants from across the country to participate for two weeks in August (!) We camped about 1/2 mile from Government Trail and hiked in and out of the gulch every day to document (draw, photograph, measure and map) the rock art. Vaughan Hadenfeldt from Bluff was the chief cook and "man for all seasons". He even directed a spectacular climb for the group to the top of Polly's Island, at one point using a ladder he had lugged all the way there for one short boost. He is one of the three men who completed the first traverse of the Comb Ridge.

It was on this trip that we learned about ARARA and URARA and joined both. We were hooked.

We have always considered it a privilege to work with Sally. She is professional, interesting, and passionate about her work. She is a fine and caring leader. She continued for many years on this project and the result of her work is at the Edge of Cedars Museum.

Our January Editors' Message pointed out that we felt it was time for someone, or others, to have the opportunity to serve as the *Vestiges* editors. We encouraged others to volunteer and discussed the possibility with some. Short answer: "No, thanks!"

In an email to President Jeff Allen in April, we summarized our efforts to recruit someone, and though unsuccessful, we made the decision to finish our term as editors with the October 2010 issue, come what may. Perhaps someone out there will be willing to take on this pleasant responsibility. We truly hope so. We would hate to see *Vestiges* die a sudden death. We have loved the opportunity to contribute to URARA.
