As of January 22, 2011, we have 166 entries in the database. This includes 95 single memberships, 69 family memberships, one student and one honorary membership. Of the 166 entries, 48 are from Utah (29%), 36 from Colorado, 21 from California, 16 from Arizona, 8 from Nevada, and 37 memberships are from various states and countries.

One year ago, URARA had 211 members listed in the database.

Editor's Message

Some of you may already be aware of last week's announcement from Utah Parks and Recreation regarding the potential closures of several of Utah's Heritage Parks and campgrounds. The short list included The Edge of the Cedars State Park Museum in Blanding, as well as parks at Green River, Vernal (Field House), Cedar City (Iron Mission), and the Territorial State House. In an understandable effort to reduce expenditures and balance the state budget, the Utah legislature has proposed cutting one-third of the operating funds for Utah State Parks, about three million dollars. The proposal is the result of a recent legislative audit. Although Senator Hinkins and Representative Christine Watkins have been barraged with phone calls, letters, and emails in support of our museum, the future for The Edge of the Cedars will not be known until at least mid-February. Please consider raising awareness among your friends and contacts with other archaeological organizations. A written paragraph or phone call to Senator Hinkins will add another voice

in support of keeping the museum open for future generations, or at least for another season!
