## Upcoming Field Trips

**Moab, UT - April 21 - 22, 2012**

We will meet on Saturday at 8:00 AM at the Moab Information Center at Center and Main.

Saturday we will go to Seven Mile Canyon and see several sites there, including the Intestine Man and the Snake-in-Mouth panels. In mid-afternoon, those who are willing to do a moderate to strenuous hike can go to a site in upper Hell Roaring Canyon. The main panel there is often called the Comet Catcher.

On Sunday we will do a day long moderate hike into upper Mill Creek to see several panels of petroglyphs.

Be prepared with appropriate footwear, sunscreen, camera, lunch, and plenty of water. Group size will be limited to 10.

**Green River, UT - May 5 - 6, 2012**

Troy and Oscar are going to tag team this field trip. Oscar will make sure we find the sites and Troy will manage the administrative issues. Our intent is to visit sites near Green River. Time permitting we hope to include Three Fingers, Black Dragon, Coal, Stubb, and Tusher Canyons. There is a first come-first served camping area along the river which we will try to utilize but can't guarantee. There is also ample hotel space in Green River.

High clearance vehicles are required. Four wheel drive may be necessary in one short section. We will attempt to carpool. Please let Troy know what kind of vehicle you have. There should not be extensive hiking associated with these sites although some short scrambles will be necessary.

Group size will be limited to 12 people. Contact Troy.

**Kanab, UT - May 30 - 31, 2012**

Just after the ARARA conference in Saint George, UT, we will visit several difficult to reach rock art sites in the Kanab area. Temperatures range from 44°F at night to 79°F during the day at the end of May.

We will meet on Wednesday and Thursday at 8:00 AM at the Grand Staircase Escalante-National Monument (GSENM) Visitor Center on the East side of Kanab, at 745 E. Highway 89, Kanab, UT, 84741.

Wednesday we hike to the Mansard petroglyph site in the Vermillion Cliffs. This hike will involve a strenuous five-mile round trip, ascending more than 1000 feet to an outcrop of Navajo sandstone. The route to this site covers steep, uneven terrain, and requires some scrambling to negotiate a seven-foot sandstone ledge.

Thursday we hike to Kanab Point petroglyph site in the Vermillion Cliffs. This hike will involve another strenuous five-mile round trip, ascending more than 1000 feet to a site with dinosaur tracks, petroglyphs, and pictographs. The route to this site covers steep, uneven terrain, and requires some scrambling.

Be prepared with appropriate footwear, hiking pole, sunscreen, camera, lunch, and plenty of water. We will carpool to the sites. Group size will be limited to 12.
