Government Shutdown

As *Vestiges* is being prepared, the federal government has been shut down. While this may have a tremendous impact on tourism in the Moab area, it will have minimal impact on symposium. We may have to rearrange one fieldtrip into Arches National Park, and it might impact a couple of speakers. The length of the shut-down is not clear at this point. We will contact any fieldtrip participants who are impacted in advance if it appears that the shut down will continue through the symposium dates.

We have many others that have been involved with their own research and preservation projects and are anxious to share the results with us. We are pleased to be able to afford them the audience that is anxious to hear what they have to say. This year we will be giving special recognition to someone who has worked in preservation for several years, and needs to be rewarded. The Preservation Session will highlight the Moab area and URARA preservation efforts around the state. Leigh Grench and Quent and Pam Baker will talk about Moab rock art that is being loved to death and the BLM efforts to save the sites. The Bakers will also talk about the National Historic Register Nomination for the Moab District. Nina Bowen will lead an in depth discussion on the rock art at Utah Lake and highlight the efforts of BLM law enforcement in making improvements. Members of the Nine Mile Coalition will talk about important developments in Nine Mile Canyon. We'll also have updates on rock art recording on private land in St. George and a review of the status of the Programmatic Agreement we signed for the Bighorn Basin in Wyoming.


Please park around the back of the symposium location and enter from the south end of the motel (near the Blu Pig Restaurant). See the attached map of the Moab Valley Inn.
