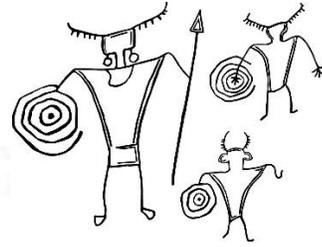

## More on Symposium

2019 commemorates URARA's 40th Anniversary and we invite you to mark your calendars if you haven't already, to be in the Washington/St. George, Utah area for the 2019 Symposium! The date is September 26th -30th. You won't want to miss it.

The location of the symposium is the Washington County Legacy Park (county fairgrounds), located between the towns of Washington and Hurricane, Utah. There are 40 camping spots available at the Park, with electricity only, for \$10.00 per night. These are on a first come basis, no reservations. You can also "dry camp" free at the venue on the dirt around the area. You will need to stay away from stables and track area, so as not to disturb the horses. If not Camping at the Legacy Park, be sure to book your hotel or campground NOW because St. George and Washington City are heavily booked that time of year for the St George Marathon and Huntsman Senior Games.

## 1. Introduction of New Board Members

Current President Steve Acerson introduced new board members Connie Bridge, Geoff Hardies and Kent Williams.

Outgoing board members are Steve Acerson, and (not present) DeLoy Norton and David Carey. Board members serve for 2 years and can extend their term for an additional 2 years

## 2. Nomination and Election of New Board Officers

The President serves for a maximum of 2 years, the Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer can serve indefinitely. None of the officers need to be board members.

The Vice President is responsible for chairing the symposium. Although the Vice-President typically becomes President following the initial 2-year term, it isn't necessary to commit to that.

The following Board Officers were elected for 2019:

1. President: Werner Duecker

Nominated by Keith Fessenden, seconded by Darlene Koerner, elected unanimously

2. Vice-President: Connie Bridge

Nominated by Steve Acerson, seconded by Geoff, elected unanimously.

3. Treasurer: Margo Fenton will continue to serve as treasurer.

4. Secretary: Nina Bowen has requested a 1-year hiatus from the office of Secretary. Carol Duecker will serve as Secretary during Nina's absence.

Werner Duecker took over management of the meeting, and thanked Steve Acerson for his term of service.

### 3. Financial Report

Margo Fenton presented a preliminary report for 2018, but several items are still outstanding. A final report will be posted on the web.

Current membership total is approximately 480. When membership level reaches 500, the cost of the Wild Apricot website hosting service will go from \$500 per year to \$1200 per year. This needs to be monitored.

Margo requested that members keep track of their volunteer hours and submit to her. Margo told the group that the website also has a link for submitting hours. The purpose of recording volunteer hours is to add credibility to the organization and provide leverage for grants and other opportunities.

### 4. URARA Funded/Paid Projects

URARA has only one ongoing project which is Dave Manley's request for \$750 for Segoe Canyon photography. There is a possibility that the Sand Dunes site will request additional funding for completion.

### 5. Symposium Planning

Symposium will be held in St. George the last weekend of September 26-30. The Washington County LegacyPark has been reserved.

The 2020 symposium will be held in Vernal.

Reviewed Last Year Comments and Issues. Troy indicated that most feedback was positive. Two speakers received generally negative reviews.

Workshops have had generally positive reviews. Workshops are generally geared toward furthering URARA's goals but also entertaining members.

Board authorized the purchase of sound equipment to include wireless microphone headsets, speakers and other necessary equipment.

Field trips need to be carefully coordinated with land managers

### 6. Conservation and Preservation

URARA needs to work toward getting more sites into the SHPO database. Before determining how to proceed with the URARA database or development of an app, URARA will meet with SHPO to determine the minimum requirements for getting site data into the database that is used by land managers.

## 7. Education

Gina Hupka and Richard Jenkinson have agreed to work on education projects. Utah school curriculum is too tight to include URARA speakers/materials.

There are 23 Charter Schools in the Utah Valley that may be receptive. A site steward assignment may accompany rock art study.

A URARA member is looking at trails and sites that may be visited at the Smith Preserve. Acersons are working with BLM to get trails and interpretative information at Lake Mountain.

Pam and Quent Baker are talking to Nate Thomas to get signs placed along Potash Road near Moab.

Troy discussed the information that has been placed on the "Education" tab on the website, and materials that may be available to post.

## 8-9. Monthly Field Trips

Field trips fill quickly and there is more demand than availability. There are some issues with people not showing up. 10% of sign-ups cancel later.

Four days in the same location is a major impact and sites are showing wear from this level of visitation.

A leader training manual was prepared but never published. Trip leaders should have Wilderness First Aid training. Trip leaders should have medical information for any member with issues.

Should new members have priority when signing up?

## 10. URARA Members - Ideas to Keep New Members Engaged

Discussion of possible methods to engage new members include housewarming parties and special invitations to the picnic and Christmas parties, priority on field trips.

## 11. Web Page

Troy explained that the website is capable of public, member-only and group (board, committee) pages. If board members see something we should be doing, please contact Troy.

Troy will redesign the look and feel of the website this year to make it more user-friendly. URARA should get the "URARA.org" domain name from Tom Getts. We currently pay him for it.

Discussion of whether we should use Wild Apricot's Paypal pay method which takes users to Paypal's (confusing) website, or use Wild Apricot's direct pay method which costs slightly more in transaction fees but is more conventional.

Troy pointed out that our web address utahrockart.org is owned by Greg Wertz.

Members have suggested that URARA update the bylaws.

Darlene, Werner, Keith and Geoff will work with member Steve Hughes to review and possibly update the bylaws. Committee will provide recommendations by next board meeting.

### 14. Publications

Dennis discussed the possibility of publishing an occasional publication. URARA previously put out a single edition of a publication called "Patina". The publication would consist of a series of pdf files posted on the website. Articles could be submitted by any interested party and would be edited by a board of URARA members.

Dennis will implement the revival of "Patina". The Editorial Board will consist of Dennis, Diana, Nina Bowen, and Connie.

Margo will add a donation link to the Facebook page.

Keith Fessenden is the URARA Archivist. URARA's archive material consists of a non-lending library in Green River and 5 boxes of records.

URARA should locate a repository for URARA's document collection (photos, papers, and donated information). Margaret is currently storing URARA's papers in her basement. Locations for an official repository for URARA papers were discussed (libraries, universities and official repositories). Edge of the Cedars museum was suggested. Keith will investigate locations for archiving URARA's records, and will purchase a hard drive (cost up to \$250) for storing archived URARA documents.
